Session 1: Overview

- Secular/ Secularization The process by which spheres and aspects of life are set apart or quarantined from the sacred.
- Sacred Any location that has been identified and designated as distinct from its surroundings, generally with religious or spiritual connotations attached. It is often looked upon as a place of encounter with the divine and therefore as a designation to which people go with clearly defined expected outcomes in mind.
- Vocation The word vocation derives from the Latin vocare "to call." The work in which a person is employed.
- Piety It denotes godliness, reverence, dutifulness and devotion.
- Shalom a Hebrew word meaning peace, harmony, wholeness, completeness, prosperity, welfare and tranquility.
- Protagonist The main character of a story.
- Antagonist An adversary in a story.
- Atonement The reconciliation of God and humankind through Jesus Christ.
- Modernity the self-definition of a generation about its own technological innovation, governance, and socioeconomics.
- Ethics Loving what God loves.
- Eschatology Branch of theology concerned with the final events in the history of the world of or humankind.
- Missio Dei It is a Latin theological term that can be translated as the "mission of God," or the "sending of God.
