










Shalom:

Jesus Redeems

1. Shalom with God - Jesus lived in complete shalom with God (John 8:29)
2. Shalom with Self - Jesus knew who He was and lived into the identity of the Beloved (Matthew 3:17)
3. Shalom with Others - Jesus lived to make peace for others (Matthew 9:36)
4. Shalom with Creation - Jesus introduces a new way of living (Dominion v Domination / Colossians 1:19-20)

“Jesus exercised dominion over creation to serve humanity. He multiplied bread and fish to feed thousands, and he smeared mud on the eyes of a blind man to give him sight (see John 9:1–12). Later Jesus was crucified on a tree. God—the Creator of the tree—was nailed to it. The original sin of humanity was committed in relation to a tree, the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. Now the redemption of humanity and the reversal of the Fall happens in relation to a tree. Then Jesus conquered death, opening his own grave. And in the end there is only one tree, the Tree of Life. The tree’s leaves are for the healing of the nations (see Revelation 22:1–2).”



We can partake in redemption – The Holy Spirit enables us to do this through our work/vocation

1. **Shalom with God** - We are redeemed children (Ephesians 5:1)
2. **Shalom with Self** - We are the beloved (1 John 4:19)
3. **Shalom with Others** - We are a family (John 13:35)
4. **Shalom with Creation** - We are cultivators (Romans 8:22)

2. As you think about Jesus' work on the cross restoring all four dimensions of shalom (with God, self, others, creation), which restored dimension offers you the most hope in this moment?
